The SOAP Method

This plan uses the SOAP Method, a simple and effective way to slow down and reflect on Scripture.

- **S – Scripture:** Write down the verse(s) that stand out to you from the day's reading.
- **O – Observation:** What is God saying? What truths or insights do you notice?
- **A – Application:** How can you apply this to your life today? What action, change, or encouragement can you draw?
- **P – Prayer:** Respond to God in prayer. Ask Him to help you live out what you've read.

Encouragement to Stay Consistent

You don't have to be perfect. There's no pressure to "catch up" or fill every page. This is not about performance; it's about presence. Showing up daily, even for a few minutes, creates space for God to speak. Let this be your quiet invitation into God's voice, God's truth, and God's heart. If you miss a day, just pick up where you left off. God meets you in every moment with grace.

How to Study the Bible Using the SOAP Method (John 3:16 Example)

Sample Day: What connection does this verse make between belief and eternal life?

This verse connects eternal life directly to belief in Jesus. It does not describe eternal life as something earned through effort or achieved by following rules. Instead, it presents eternal life as a gift that comes through trusting what God has done. Belief here is not about having perfect understanding or flawless faith. It is about placing trust in Jesus and receiving what God offers through Him. According to this verse, eternal life begins with belief and flows from God's love, not from human achievement.

S – Scripture: *Write out today's passage.*

For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.

O – Observation: *What is happening? What do you notice?*

This verse explains why God acts toward people the way He does. God's love comes first. He did not wait for people to be good enough or understand everything. He gave His Son because He cares about the whole world. The verse also shows a choice. Trusting Jesus leads to life, not loss. This promise is open to anyone.

A – Application: *How can you apply this to your life?*

This verse invites me to consider what I believe about God and about myself. I do not have to clean up my life before God cares about me. God's love is already offered. Today, I can respond by being honest about my questions, fears, or doubts, and by taking one small step toward trusting what God says here.

P – Prayer: *Write a short prayer asking God to help you apply what you've read.*

God, if You are real, help me understand Your love. Help me see what it means to trust You and follow You. I bring my questions and uncertainties to You. If this verse is true, help me begin to believe it and receive the life You offer. Amen.

You don't have to have everything figured out or fully understood. Do your best for these 30 days and pay attention to how your faith grows. Faith often begins with a single honest step.

Week 3: How the Word Guides Us

Day 29 – 2 Corinthians 3:18: In what ways are you seeing yourself being transformed more into Christ's likeness?

A – Application: *How can you apply this to your life?*

P – Prayer: *Write a short prayer asking God to help you apply what you've read.*

Day 30 – Revelation 1:3: How has this 30-day journey changed the way you approach God’s Word?

S – Scripture: *Write out today’s passage.*

O – Observation: *What is happening? What do you notice?*

A – Application: *How can you apply this to your life?*

P – Prayer: *Write a short prayer asking God to help you apply what you’ve read.*

What's Next? Continuing the Habit

Finishing this plan is not the end of your Bible reading; it is the beginning of a sustainable habit.

If you've completed these 30 days, pause for a moment and recognize what you've done. You showed up. You made space for Scripture and prayer. The goal of this plan was never perfection. It was to help you build a habit of listening for God's voice through His Word.

As you move forward, there is no single "right" next step. Growth often continues best when it remains simple and intentional. Here are a few ways you might continue using what you've learned.

Option 1: Repeat the Process

Choose a new set of Scripture passages and continue using the SOAP Method. Repetition builds confidence, and familiar structure allows deeper reflection. You may find that the same method reveals new insights as your understanding grows.

Option 2: Focus on One Book of the Bible

Select one book of the Bible, such as a Gospel or a short New Testament letter, and work through it slowly using SOAP. Reading with patience helps you notice themes, questions, and connections you may have missed before.

Option 3: Study With Others

Consider using the SOAP Method with a friend, family member, or small group. Shared reflection often brings encouragement and perspective. Listening to how others observe and apply Scripture can strengthen your own understanding.

Option 4: Explore Additional Free Resources
