Activity Guide & Strategies

1. Word Search

- **Purpose:** Helps you spot key people, places, and themes.
- **Strategy:** Look for one word at a time. Try circling names and underlining locations in different colors.
- **Extra Challenge:** After finding each word, say it out loud and explain what it means in the chapter.

2. Word Scramble

- **Purpose:** Reinforces memory of key words and terms.
- **Strategy:** Look for familiar letter patterns (like “el” in *angel* or “iah” in *Messiah*). Think about the chapter content—it gives clues!

3. Missing Vowels

- **Purpose:** Strengthens vocabulary and attention to detail.

5. Cryptogram - A cryptogram is a secret code where every letter in a Bible verse is swapped with another letter. Your job is to crack the code and reveal the original Scripture message

How to Solve a Cryptogram

1. Start with one-letter words.

These are usually “I” or “a.”

2. Look for repeating patterns.

A three-letter word repeated often could be “the” or “and.”

3. Pay attention to punctuation.

Apostrophes or commas give clues (like contractions: *don't*, *he's*).

4. Use what you know about the verse.

If the clue is John 3:16, you might expect to see “God,” “love,” or “world.”

Substitute one letter at a time.

Pencil in possibilities and adjust as you figure out more letters.

Example:

If **A = D**, **B = E**, **C = F**, etc., then the word “**GOD**” would be written as “**JRG**.”

6. Coloring Page

- **Purpose:** Provides reflection time and creative connection to Scripture.
- **Strategy:** Think about the message or story while you color.
- **Extra Challenge:** Write a prayer or short thought near the image.

Tips for Parents, Teachers, or Group Leaders:

- Use activities after Bible reading to review what was learned.
- Encourage discussion after each puzzle or coloring page.
- Allow kids or students to explain their thinking. It helps truth stick!
- Mix activities with memory verses, games, or worship time.

John 1: The Word Became Flesh

Reading:

Read John Chapter One in your favorite translation of the Bible.

Key Verse:

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

—John 1:14 (NIV)

Bible Background:

John's Gospel opens differently from the others. Instead of beginning with Jesus' birth, John reaches back into eternity. He declares that Jesus is the eternal Word (Logos) who was with God and was God (John 1:1). Through Him, all things were made (John 1:3). The chapter highlights both Jesus' divine origin and His entrance into human history. John the Baptist serves as a witness, identifying Jesus as the "Lamb of God" (John 1:29) and pointing others to Him. The chapter closes with Jesus calling His first followers, including Andrew, Peter, Philip, and Nathanael.

Devotional Thought:

John 1:1–3 tells us something incredible: Jesus is not just a man, He is the eternal God. He was there before anything existed. He is the Creator of all things, but He didn't stay distant. Verse 14 gives us the heart of the Gospel:

“The Word became flesh.” God wrapped Himself in humanity and came to live among us.

That word “dwelling” in verse 14 means He “tabernacled” or “pitched His tent” among us. It evokes the memory of the tabernacle in the wilderness, where God’s presence dwelt among His people. In Jesus, that presence isn’t behind a curtain. That presence walks our streets.

We see His glory not in lightning bolts or thrones but in compassion, healing, truth, and grace (John 1:14, 17). We see it when He calls fishermen (John 1:42), speaks truth to skeptics (John 1:47–50), and invites the forgotten to follow Him.

This chapter reminds us that God is always near.

Reflection Questions:

1. What does John 1:1–3 teach you about who Jesus truly is?
2. Why is it significant that Jesus “made His dwelling among us” (John 1:14)?
3. How does the image of Jesus as the “Lamb of God” (John 1:29) shape your understanding of His mission?
4. In what ways can you reflect Christ’s grace and truth (John 1:14, 17)?

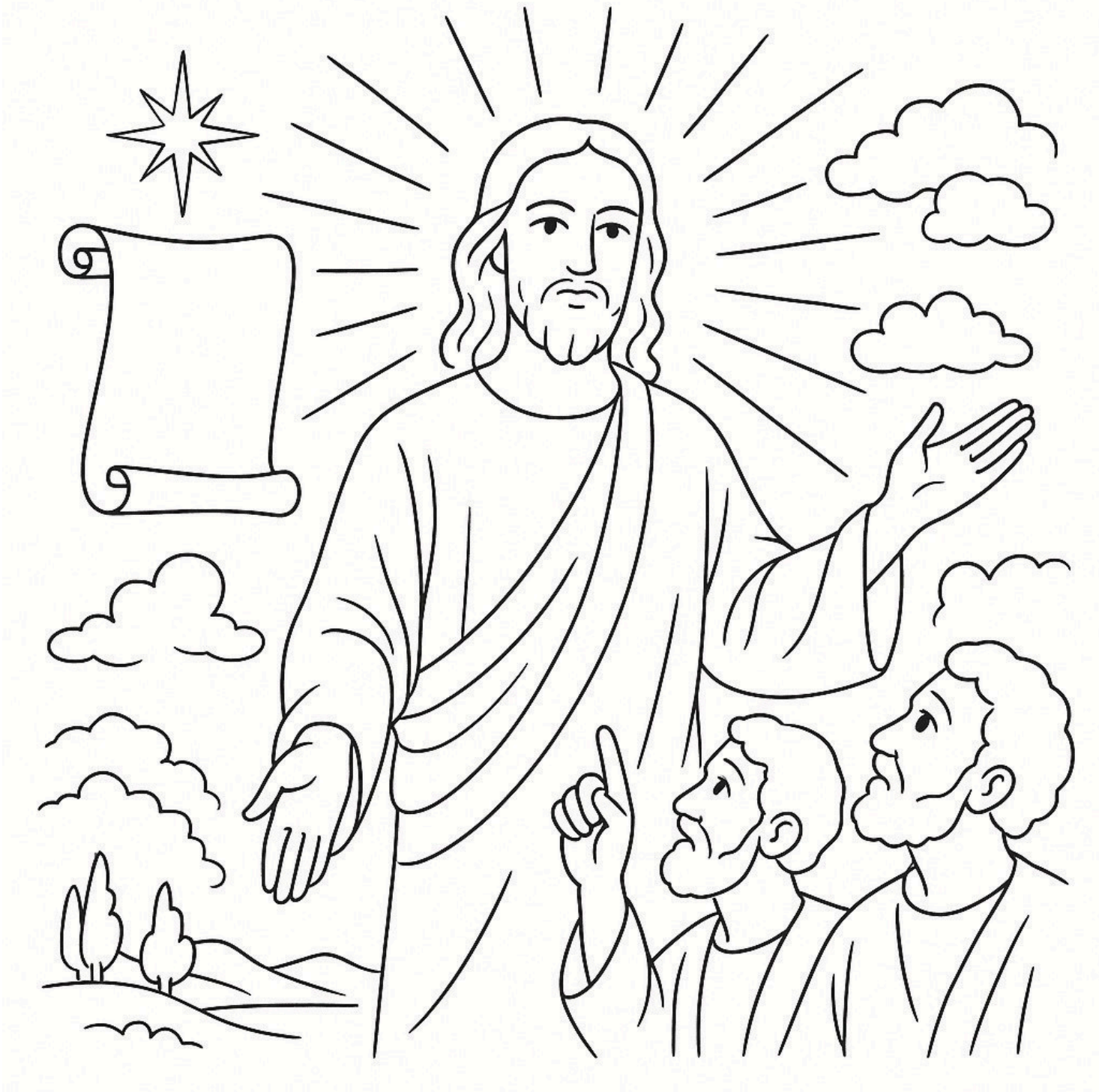

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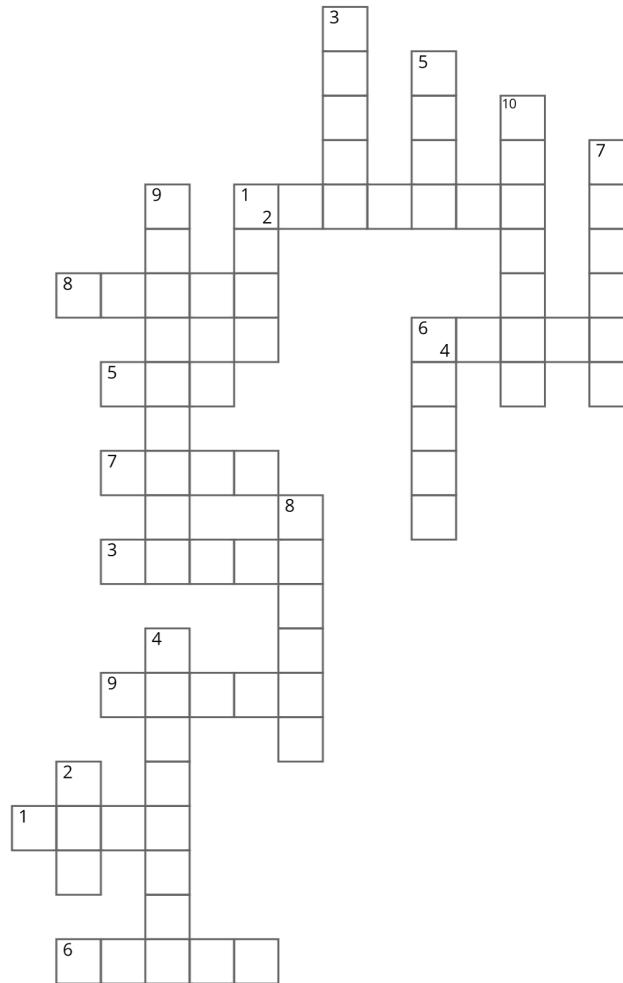

John 2: Water into Wine and House Cleaning

Reading:

Read John Chapter Two in your favorite translation of the Bible.

Key Verse:

What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

—John 2:11 (NIV)

Bible Background:

John 2 presents two dramatic moments in Jesus' early ministry. The first is the wedding at Cana, where Jesus performs His first recorded miracle, turning water into wine (John 2:1–11). This miracle wasn't just about saving a party; it revealed His divine authority and marked the beginning of His public ministry. The second event takes place in Jerusalem, where Jesus drives out the merchants and money changers from the temple (John 2:13–17). Both incidents show different aspects of Jesus: His compassion and His holiness.

Devotional Thought:

The first sign Jesus performs isn't raising the dead or healing the sick. It's saving a wedding from embarrassment by turning water into wine (John 2:6–10). That may seem small, but it shows that God cares about the details of our lives. Jesus didn't just come for the dramatic moments. He also came for the ordinary ones.

So when His mother tells the servants, “Do whatever he tells you” (John 2:5), she speaks a truth that still applies today.

Then the scene shifts. Jesus enters the temple and sees it overrun with greed. He flips tables, drives out animals, and declares, “Stop turning my Father’s house into a market!” (John 2:16). His passion for purity and worship is fierce. He’s not just gentle, He’s just. He loves deeply, but He also confronts corruption head-on.

These two moments, the wine and the whip, celebration and confrontation, reveal the whole heart of Christ. He brings joy where there’s a lack and truth where there’s sin. Both are part of His glory (John 2:11), and both call for a response: Will we believe and follow?

3. How does Jesus’ cleansing of the temple (John 2:13–17) challenge your view of Him?

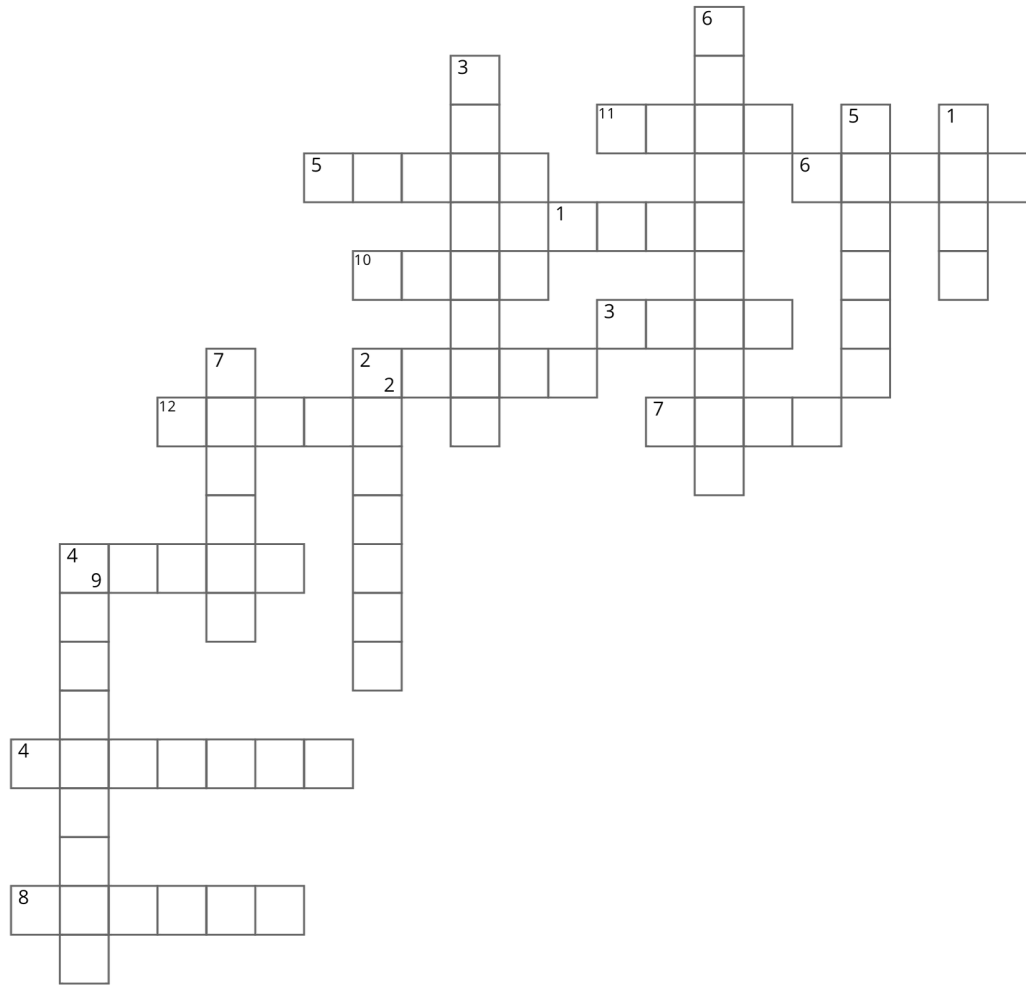

John 3: You Must Be Born Again

Reading:

Read John Chapter Three in your favorite translation of the Bible.

Key Verse:

Jesus replied, 'Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again.'

—John 3:3 (NIV)

Bible Background:

John 3 contains the conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus, one of the most well-known conversations in Scripture. Nicodemus was a Pharisee and a member of the Jewish ruling council. Nicodemus approaches Jesus at night, perhaps out of fear or deep curiosity. Jesus tells him that spiritual rebirth, not religious status, is the key to entering God's kingdom (John 3:3–8). This chapter also includes John 3:16, a verse that captures the heart of the Gospel. Later, John the Baptist exalts Jesus, declaring that "He must become greater; I must become less" (John 3:30).

Devotional Thought:

Nicodemus was a man of influence, knowledge, and religious devotion. With all he had, he was missing something. When he met with Jesus under the cover of night (John 3:2), Jesus didn't flatter him. Jesus cut straight to the truth: "You

must be born again” (John 3:3). Spiritual life isn’t inherited or earned, it’s received by faith through the Holy Spirit (John 3:5–6).

That truth still confronts us. We can have all the correct information and still miss transformation. Jesus calls us not just to believe facts about God but to experience new life through Him.

Then we get to the most famous verse in the Bible: “For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.” (John 3:16). It’s not just about knowledge, it’s about love. God gave. Jesus came. The Spirit moves. We respond.

John the Baptist closes this chapter with a reminder we all need: “He must become greater; I must become less” (John 3:30). That’s the posture of someone who has truly been born again.

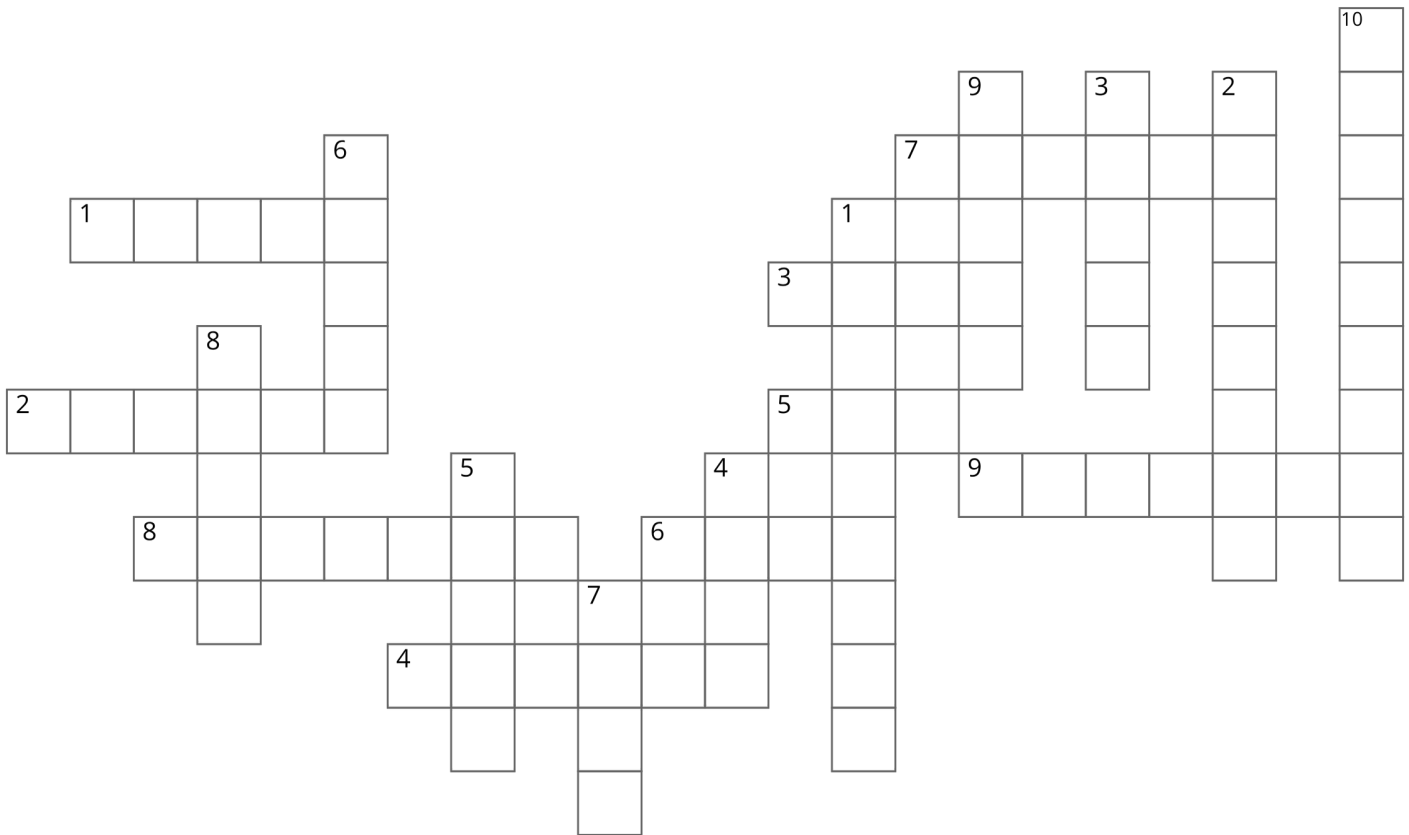

John 4: Living Water for a Thirsty Soul

Reading:

Read John Chapter Four in your favorite translation of the Bible.

Key Verse:

But whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.

—John 4:14 (NIV)

Bible Background:

In this chapter, Jesus travels through Samaria and meets a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well (John 4:4–6). Jews and Samaritans usually avoided each other, and it was highly unusual for a Jewish man to speak alone with a woman, especially one with a shameful past. Jesus, knowing who she is, chooses to initiate a life-changing conversation with her. He reveals her brokenness, offers her living water, and eventually identifies Himself as the Messiah (John 4:26). The woman becomes a witness to her entire village (John 4:28–30, 39–42). The chapter also includes the healing of a royal official's son through faith in Jesus' word alone (John 4:46–54).

Devotional Thought:

Jesus broke every cultural expectation when He sat at a well and asked a Samaritan woman for a drink (John 4:7–9). She came to the well burdened by shame, avoiding others. But Jesus saw her, spoke to her, and offered her

something better: living water (John 4:10). Her past didn't disqualify her. It became the very door through which Jesus walked into her life.

He exposed the truth (John 4:16–18), not to shame her but to heal her. He wasn't offering religion. He offered a relationship and worship “in the Spirit and in truth” (John 4:24). For the first time, someone saw her completely and didn't walk away.

The woman left her water jar behind (John 4:28). Why did she do that? Because she found what she really needed. She ran to tell everyone about the man who “told me everything I ever did” (John 4:29). Her shame was replaced with testimony. Her isolation turned into influence.

At the end of the chapter, we see that Jesus can heal with a word alone (John 4:50). His power isn't limited by distance, just as our failures don't limit His grace.

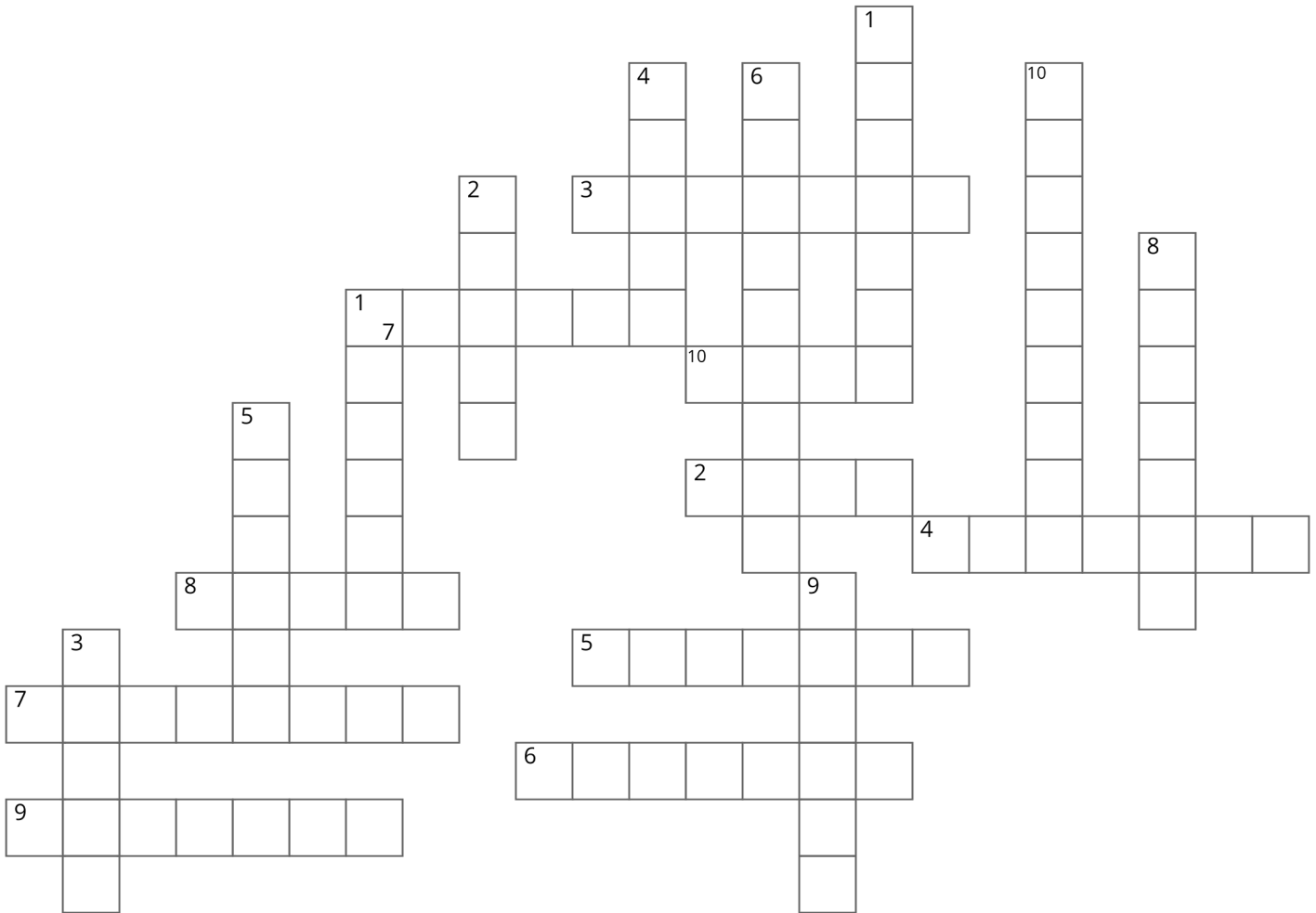

John 5: Do You Want to Be Well?

Reading:

Read John Chapter Five in your favorite translation of the Bible.

Key Verse:

Then Jesus said to him, 'Get up! Pick up your mat and walk.' At once, the man was cured; he picked up his mat and walked.

—John 5:8–9a (NIV)

Bible Background:

John 5 begins with Jesus healing a man who had been disabled for 38 years, lying beside the pool of Bethesda in Jerusalem (John 5:1–9). The man believed he needed someone to help him into the water for healing, but Jesus bypasses superstition and speaks healing directly into his life. This miracle, performed on the Sabbath, triggers controversy with the religious leaders (John 5:10–18). The rest of the chapter includes Jesus' powerful teaching about His unity with the Father, His authority to give life, and the witness that confirms His identity (John 5:19–47).

Devotional Thought:

Imagine sitting in the same place for 38 years, hoping for change, but nothing ever improves (John 5:5–7). That's the man at the pool of Bethesda. He wasn't just paralyzed physically. He was paralyzed emotionally, mentally, and spiritually. Then Jesus walks up and asks a strange question: "Do you want to

get well?” (John 5:6). At first glance, it sounds obvious. But Jesus knew that healing isn’t just a physical matter; healing requires desire, surrender, and faith.

The man doesn’t even directly answer the question. He explains why he can’t be healed; he says no one will help him (John 5:7). Jesus doesn’t argue or scold. He simply says, “Get up! Pick up your mat and walk” (John 5:8). The man is healed immediately.

Jesus not only healed his body, but He also called him to live a new life. Jesus sees him again and says, “Stop sinning or something worse may happen to you” (John 5:14). This is a reminder that physical healing is beneficial, but spiritual wholeness is even more valuable.

Jesus also uses this moment to reveal His divine authority, which encompasses the power to heal, judge, and give eternal life (John 5:21–27). This isn’t just a miracle story. It’s a call to trust in the One who sees us, speaks to us, and makes us whole.
