

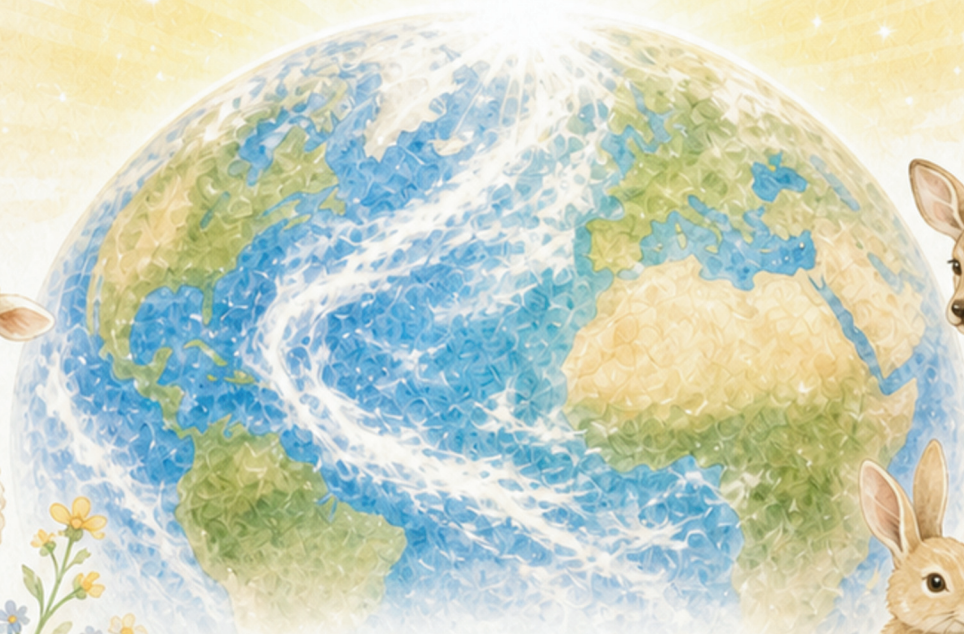

A World Made with Love

Thank you for downloading this free **5-Day Family Devotional**.

This resource was created to help parents and children spend a few simple, meaningful minutes together in God's Word. Each day follows a gentle Bible study rhythm based on the SOAP method: **Scripture, Observation, Application, and Prayer**.

For children, we have made the language simple:

Scripture means we read God's Word together.

What Did God Do? helps children notice what is happening in the Bible passage.

What This Means for Us helps families talk about how God's Word connects to everyday life.

Let's Pray gives families a chance to respond to God together.

This devotional is not meant to feel like homework. It is meant to be a guided conversation between parent and child. You can read, talk, write, draw, or pray in whatever way works best for your family.

Each day can be completed in about five minutes. Keep it simple. Keep it warm. Let this be a small beginning toward helping your child learn how to listen to Scripture, notice what God has done, and respond with faith.

How to Use This Devotional

This 5-day family devotional introduces children to a simple Bible study rhythm based on the SOAP method: **Scripture, Observation, Application, and Prayer.**

The goal is not to create a perfect lesson. The goal is to guide a meaningful conversation between parent and child. Each day can be completed in about **5–10 minutes.** That is enough time to read the verse, ask the guiding question, talk together, write or draw a simple response, and pray.

This devotional can fit naturally into your family rhythm. You might use it:

In the morning to begin the day with God's Word.

After school to slow down and reconnect.

At bedtime to end the day with Scripture and prayer.

Choose the time that works best for your family and try to use the same time each day. A simple rhythm repeated consistently can help children learn that Bible study is not only something we do at church. It can become part of everyday life.



What is SOAP?

Scripture – Read the Bible verse out loud together. Be careful to read slowly and clearly. You may want to read it more than once. The goal is to help your child hear God’s Word and begin to understand that the Bible is not just another book. The goal is to help your child begin to understand that the Bible is God’s Word, not just another book. You may ask open-ended questions such as “What did you notice?”, “What did God say?”, “What did God make?”, or “What happened in this verse”?

What Did God Do? – This section helps your child **observe** the Bible passage. Ask the question, then give your child time to answer. They may notice something simple and that is okay. The goal is to help them pay attention to what God says and does. You are not trying to explain everything. The goal is to simply help your child pay attention.

What This Means for Us – This section helps your family talk about **application**. Ask, “What does this teach us?” or “How can we remember this today?” Your child may write an answer, draw a picture, or talk while you write their words. Keep the conversation simple. The answer does not need to be long, complicated, or even complete.

Let’s Pray – Use this section to respond to God together. A parent may **pray**, a child may **pray**, you may let your child repeat a short prayer after you, or you may write a short prayer as a family.

Keep it simple, warm, and conversational. Let your child ask questions. Let them give short answers. Let this devotional become a small step toward helping your family enjoy God’s Word together.

The goal of the **SOAP Method** is not to complicate Bible study. The goal is to help your child learn a pattern they can use for the rest of their life:

Read God’s Word.

Notice what it says.

Think about how it applies to their life.

Respond to God in prayer.
