Focus Truth

Creation gives us enough light to start seeking, but it also invites us to ask whether the Creator has given us more.



Before You Begin

Creation can awaken wonder, but it also leaves us with questions. This worksheet is designed to help seekers and believers reflect honestly on what creation starts, what it cannot finish, and why it is reasonable to keep asking whether the Creator has made Himself known more clearly. Move slowly, think carefully, and leave room for honest questions.

1. Let Creation Start the Search

Creation can awaken wonder. Let it do that. Use the prompts below to reflect on how the world around you has already stirred questions in your mind.

What has creation already made you wonder about?

What part of creation most often stirs your curiosity about the Creator?

What questions does creation raise for you that it cannot fully answer?

2. Be Honest About Creation's Limits

Creation points us toward the Creator, but it does not answer every question. Reflect on both the value and the limits of what creation can show us.

What can creation honestly show us about the Creator?

What questions does creation begin, but not finish, for you?

Why is it important to admit creation's limits without dismissing its value?

3. Examine Your Expectations

Many people hope the Creator would make Himself known in a dramatic or undeniable way. Use these prompts to examine your expectations honestly.

Have you ever wished the Creator would make Himself known in a dramatic or undeniable way?

What did you hope that would accomplish?

Am I open to the Creator making Himself known in a way I did not expect? Why or why not?

4. Do Not Confuse Dramatic with Trustworthy

A dramatic moment may feel powerful, but trustworthy communication would need to do more than impress us. Think through the strengths and limits below.

A. Why might a physical appearance still leave questions?

B. Why might a private message be difficult for others to test?

C. Why might a dramatic sign still fall short of helping us know the Creator's heart?

D. Why might a one-time experience not be enough when doubts rise later?

What Would Help Us Know the Creator More Clearly?

Number these qualities from 1 to 5, with 1 being the quality that seems most important to you.

- Clear enough to teach
- Stable enough to preserve
- Public enough to examine
- Personal enough to call for a response
- Shareable enough to reach future generations

5. Keep Seeking with Humility

Creation gives us enough light to start seeking, but it also invites us to ask whether the Creator has given us more. Use these final prompts to think about your next step.

What does it look like for you to keep seeking honestly?

Are you willing to consider that the Creator may have made Himself known in a way you did not expect?

The Next Question

In the next Theological Thursday post, we will consider a question many people may not ask carefully enough: Why would the Creator speak through a book? At first, that may sound strange. But a written way of making Himself known may be more reasonable than we think. It can be preserved, shared, examined, taught, remembered, and passed on beyond one person, one moment, and one generation.
